Town of Dupont Board Meetings

Town Board meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month at the Dupont Town Hall at 7 P.M., unless posted otherwise. The posting locations for the Town of Dupont notices are at the Town Hall, the Town of Dupont website, and Dupont Cheese. Unofficial information is also provided to the Marion Advertiser and printed at their discretion.

General information

Town Hall

The hall and grounds are available to residents of the town to rent. A fee of \$40 is charged. The hall is to be cleaned and the garbage hauled away by the renting party immediately upon the completion of your event.

Block Grant

Dupont works with Wisconsin in providing funds for home improvement through a Community Development Block Grant. This is a loan program for low and middle income homeowners. Individual loans are based on income levels and used for housing rehabilitation. Things such as insulation, windows, siding, and handicap accessibility are examples of what is eligible. The loans are 0% interest and have no monthly payment. They get paid back when the home changes ownership or sooner if desired by the owners. All funds are currently loaned out. New loans can be made when the existing loans are repaid. Contact Kris Pethick at CAP Services 715-343-7142 for information.

Fire Numbers

This is a reminder that these signs are designed so that emergency personnel can find you when you need them. It is the property owners responsibility to keep these signs visible, upright and free of obstruction.

Building and driveway permits, conditional use permits

Generally any building project requires a permit. Using your property for things not normally allowed under the zoning program require you obtain a conditional use permit. Starting a retail business or

manufacturing facility from your home would be examples of when a conditional use permit is required. Contact our local zoning administrator, Dennis Desens 715-823-2989, before you start your project. He will help you with what needs a permit and what does not.

Ditches

Town easements along the town roads are 33 feet from the centerline in both directions. This permits the Town to remove trees, brush, and any obstructions when reconstructing or maintenance work is being done. Please consider this when fencing, landscaping, working fields etc. Shrubbery and trees in the right of way may be accidental victims of our weed spraying, ditching or brushing programs. Landscaping and fencing may get removed to maintain safe right of ways. Cropping to the road shoulder impairs a driver's vision and tends to destroy the ditch and thus the proper drainage. Please consider this before tilling up to the road edge or into a ditch. **And, please, do not roll your field stones into the ditches. They have created a lot of damage to equipment when we do the ditch mowing. The Town removed many stones in 2013. New stones rolled into the ditches will be removed at the property owners expense.**

Trees in the right of way.

State statute requires that trees planted along town roads must be a minimum of 10 feet from the road right of way. This means trees must be set back at least 43 feet from the centerline when planted along the road. That is the law. Some areas planted in the last several years are too close. They will shade the winter roads and may create hazardous conditions. The Town Board also recommends staying at least 10 feet from neighboring lot lines with any tree plantings. Trees planted closer to the property line will spread over the line in the years to come and create the potential for conflict. Common sense now can prevent hard feelings in the future. Greater set backs could make sense in many cases.

Burning Permits

Whenever you want to start any kind of outdoor fire for reasons other than cooking or warming the body, you need to obtain a burning permit from a forest ranger, DNR designee, or our local fire chief Joe Stuhr 715-250-4604. Even camp fires are regulated when conditions are dry. Check with our fire chief or the DNR if you are in question. Do not wait until you strike the match! Advance notice is imperative. Fire personnel need to be aware of your plans so they can respond appropriately if someone else mistakenly calls in your controlled fire.

Fire Calls and Emergency Services - Dial 911

The Town is part of the 5 municipalities comprising the Marion Area Fire Department for fire protection services. We are also part of the 12 municipalities comprising the Clintonville Area Ambulance Service (CAAS). Fees are charged to the Town and part is passed along to the persons utilizing fire or ambulance services. Law enforcement is provided by the Waupaca County Sheriff's Department. Dial 911 for an emergency situation.

Dog License

ALL dogs in the Town of Dupont MUST have a license and MUST have up to date vaccination records. Dog bites and pets running at large are a growing problem in rural Wisconsin and in Dupont. Please keep your pet under control and in good health. **Barking or straying dogs DO NOT make good neighbors.** We have always been able to rely on the good sense of our neighbors to have only the pets they can properly care for and control. The Town has not had to enforce our dog ordinance so, please, let's keep it that way. License fees for spayed and neutered are \$6.00 and others are \$10.00

Garbage Service

Our garbage contract hauler is Graichen Sanitation 1-920-982-4116. Garbage and recycling pickup is every Monday. All of our recyclables can be put in one container and set out separate from the garbage making it obvious to the hauler which is garbage and which is recyclables. If the collection day falls on a

holiday the collection date is normally pushed back one day later. Phone Graichens at 1-920-982-4116 for specific garbage or recycling questions. Do not "bring in" garbage from relatives and friends that live outside the Town for disposal.

Road Maintenance & Construction

Our annual road budget is approximately \$127,000 of which approximately \$30,000 is used for mowing the ditches and plowing of snow leaving approximately \$90,000 for reconstruction and maintenance projects. It takes about \$110,000 to reconstruct 1 mile of town road with a 2 inch blacktop covering and about \$160,000 per mile with a 3 1/2" covering. This is 3-5 times the cost in 1995. Road aid paid by the State is roughly equivalent to 1995 levels. This is why Towns all over the state are so concerned with the care of the town roads. We have to do more with less and this means caring for our existing roads is a top priority.

Implements of Husbandry legislation- Wisconsin Statute 377

The State legislature has finalized the "Implements of Husbandry" (meaning farm implements) legislation which updated rules for traveling the state, county and local roads with tractors, trucks and machinery. Weights per axle, widths and heights have all been addressed. Permits are required to get permission to exceed the new limits in the law.

Seasonal Weight Limits

Weight limits on town roads are a tool that towns all across the state use to protect the local roads. Town roads are not built to the same specifications as county or state highways and are not designed to regularly carry heavy weights. Please respect the road limits when posted in the spring. Use the county and state highways as much as possible whenever you need to move heavy loads. Help protect our roads and our budget. The "Implements of Husbandry" legislation has imposed updated rules regarding weights and widths on the roads.

Town Board and Citizens of Dupont:

Last year, we took it upon ourselves to decorate the Town Hall with the hope of making it more inviting and popular.

We, along with the Sunrise 4-H, Mike Rohloff, and the help of a few others donated our own time, money, and materials to give the hall a face lift after the Grant project completion.

This year, we would like to complete the project, but are looking for assistance from board funds or donors.

If we don't advertise our goal, nobody will know we need help. Please consider funding for the following, or let us post a wish list that could attract donations.

We have (in the closet) decorative lights to hang above the island, and also new ceiling fans for both rooms. We've checked with Olson's Rural electric and the estimate would be \$750 to install them. The bill would be reduced if we helped as possible. Mainly as the floor crew to hand materials and tools to the ladder crew. We are volunteering to be the ground crew. We are also hoping our own local talent could change out the ceiling fans to save \$???

The tin ceilings need paint. We haven't gotten estimates for this as it is more cost than we are willing to commit to. The one area has rusted through and there is a hole. We are looking for a new (or used) piece to tack over that poor spot.

The wood floors need refinishing with a commercial or marine varnish. A good resource is James Ludvigsen from Gresham. His # is: 715-787-3560. He did work at St Johns in Marion and was very clean and reasonably priced. He is also state certified, as the old finishes have toxins in them.

Suggestion: When it is time to replace the windows in the big hall, please replace the one nearest the front door with a handicap width door. The "porch" roof could be removed which would restore the historic look of the building. Most of all, the doorway would enter from a flat surface. (Hate to say it, but the kitchen entry is still very awkward for a wheelchair to maneuver). The broken cement stairway & ramp could then be removed.

The old entry area could be used for storage for chairs, etc. The old window should be replaced by a better display to post town news to the outside; leaving the top portion as a transom to light that room. There are already funds set aside for the display board?

Remove the voting booths because they are no longer needed and take up much needed room. Someone please get them out of there! Bring the old chalk board back into the room so it can be used for fun signs at events or just for kids to enjoy. It would also add character.

Fresh counter tops would be welcome. One of the main attractions to this building for family reunions and events is the wonderful kitchen & serving area. Can one of our cabinet builders get them wholesale for us?

The wall in the kitchen where the chairs are parked is getting damaged from the chairs and needs wainscot or in the least a chair rail.

The records room can use reducing. There are nice shelves. The old safe could be sold for scrap. It is no longer of useful or historical value. The historical society has several of them so it's time to go. The State historical society has expressed interest in the old record books. The records themselves have been saved to microfiche. The books were moldy and will always be moldy unless someone has the resources to restore them . What are we keeping them for? We do not have the funding or means to preserve these records. Let's share them with someone who can maintain them for future generations to enjoy.

Please keep us in mind when making changes and improvements to the building. Our volunteer committee will gladly offer perspective in keeping the historic look that is so inviting. We will gladly help when we can.

Hopefully, this quaint old hall will attract more users and in turn, help pay for these updates.

We understand the budget is tight, but the township committed to keeping this building when we invested in the "overhaul". Let's go all the way.
