Office of the Waupaca County Clerk To the voters of Waupaca County

Notice is hereby given of a spring election to be held in Waupaca County on April 5, 2022 at which the officers named below shall be nominated. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, for a referendum, if any, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification*
- sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word “exempt.”**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Where Paper Ballots are Used

The voter shall make a mark (X) in the square next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall make a mark (X) in the square next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall make a mark (X) in the square next to "no" if opposed to the question.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device* (“*ImageCast Evolution-ICE*”) to mark an **optical scan ballot**, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

Where Touch Screen Voting is Used

The voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **paper ballot** is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspectors' initials on the outside do show. The voter shall deposit the voted ballot in the ballot box or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit and shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **optical scan ballot** is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter may insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **touch screen ballot** is cast, the voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

Spoiling Ballots

If a voter spoils a **paper or optical scan** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

The voter may spoil a **touch screen** ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM TOWN OF ST LAWRENCE APRIL 5, 2022

Referendum Election Details

At an election to be held in the Town of St Lawrence, Waupaca County, on April 5, 2022, the following proposed Ordinance will be submitted to a vote of the people:

ORDINANCE No. 2022-01

The Town Board of the Town of St Lawrence, Waupaca County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:
That, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 60.30(1e)(a), the office of the Town Clerk shall be filled by appointment of a majority of the members-elect of the town board. The term of office for the appointed position shall be set by the town board, but may not exceed 3 years per § 60.30(1e)(c). The town board may re-appoint the officer for additional terms.
However, removal by the town board during a given term of office may only be for “cause” as defined under § 17.001 and required by § 60.30(1e)(f).

This ordinance is subject to approval by the town electors in a referendum, which is hereby called by the Town Board to be held on April 5, 2022.

The referendum question shall be: “Shall the person holding the office of Town Clerk in the Town of St Lawrence be appointed by the town board?” The salary of the appointed position shall be set by the town board and may not be reduced during the term of office. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its town board passage, notice after passage per § 60.80 and also its referendum approval by the town electors as required by § 60.30(1e)(b). Adopted this 3rd day of January, 2022.

Ballot Text

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

“Shall the person holding the office of Town Clerk in the Town of St Lawrence be appointed by the town board?”

Explanation

A “Yes” vote means: The Town Board will appoint the Town Clerk. The position of Town Clerk will no longer be an elected position and therefore not appear on any ballots for Town Board elections. The Town Board will hire the best qualified person to serve as Town Clerk.

A “No” vote means: The position of Town Clerk will remain an elected position and appear on the ballot for the electorate to decide who should serve as Town Clerk.

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM ELECTION SCHOOL DISTRICT OF TIGERTON APRIL 5, 2022

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a referendum election to be held in the School District of Tigerton on April 5, 2022, the following proposed Revenue Limit Resolution of the School Board will be submitted to a vote of the people:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET TO EXCEED THE REVENUE LIMIT FOR FIVE YEARS FOR NON-RECURRING PURPOSES

BE IT RESOLVED by the School District of Tigerton, Shawano and Waupaca Counties, Wisconsin, that the revenues included in the School District budget, for five years, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year and through the 2026-2027 school year, be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by up to \$450,000 in the 2022-2023 school year, up to \$500,000 in the 2023-2024 school year, up to \$550,000 in the 2024-2025 school year, up to \$600,000 in the 2025-2026 school year, and up to \$650,000 in the 2026-2027 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing operational and maintenance expenses, including paying debt within the operating budget; funding long-range plans for facilities, equipment, safety, technology infrastructure, and curriculum and instruction; and fair and competitive staff compensation.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

“Shall the School District of Tigerton, Shawano and Waupaca Counties, Wisconsin, for five years, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year and through the 2026-2027 school year, be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by up to \$450,000 in the 2022-2023 school year, up to \$500,000 in the 2023-2024 school year, up to \$550,000 in the 2024-2025 school year, up to \$600,000 in the 2025-2026 school year, and up to \$650,000 in the 2026-2027 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing operational and maintenance expenses, including paying debt within the operating budget; funding long-range plans for facilities, equipment, safety, technology infrastructure, and curriculum and instruction; and fair and competitive staff compensation?”

EXPLANATION AND EFFECT OF VOTE

The referendum election ballot will ask District voters to vote “yes” or “no” on the referendum election question as set forth above.

A “yes” vote on the question is a vote to authorize the School District of Tigerton budget to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for five years, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year and through the 2026-2027 school year, by up to \$450,000 in the 2022-2023 school year, up to \$500,000 in the 2023-2024 school year, up to \$550,000 in the 2024-2025 school year, up to \$600,000 in the 2025-2026 school year, and up to \$650,000 in the 2026-2027 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing operational and maintenance expenses, including paying debt within the operating budget; funding long-range plans for facilities, equipment, safety, technology infrastructure, and curriculum and instruction; and fair and competitive staff compensation.

A “no” vote on the question is a vote to deny the School District of Tigerton budget to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for five years, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year and through the 2026-2027 school year, by up to \$450,000 in the 2022-2023 school year, up to \$500,000 in the 2023-2024 school year, up to \$550,000 in the 2024-2025 school year, up to \$600,000 in the 2025-2026 school year, and up to \$650,000 in the 2026-2027 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing operational and maintenance expenses, including paying debt within the operating budget; funding long-range plans for facilities, equipment, safety, technology infrastructure, and curriculum and instruction; and fair and competitive staff compensation.

In the event a majority of the voters voting on the question vote “yes,” the District will be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, for five years, beginning with the 2022-2023 school year and through the 2026-2027 school year, by up to \$450,000 in the 2022-2023 school year, up to \$500,000 in the 2023-2024 school year, up to \$550,000 in the 2024-2025 school year, up to \$600,000 in the 2025-2026 school year, and up to \$650,000 in the 2026-2027 school year for non-recurring purposes consisting of ongoing operational and maintenance expenses, including paying debt within the operating budget; funding long-range plans for facilities, equipment, safety, technology infrastructure, and curriculum and instruction; and fair and competitive staff compensation; if a majority vote “no” on the question set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

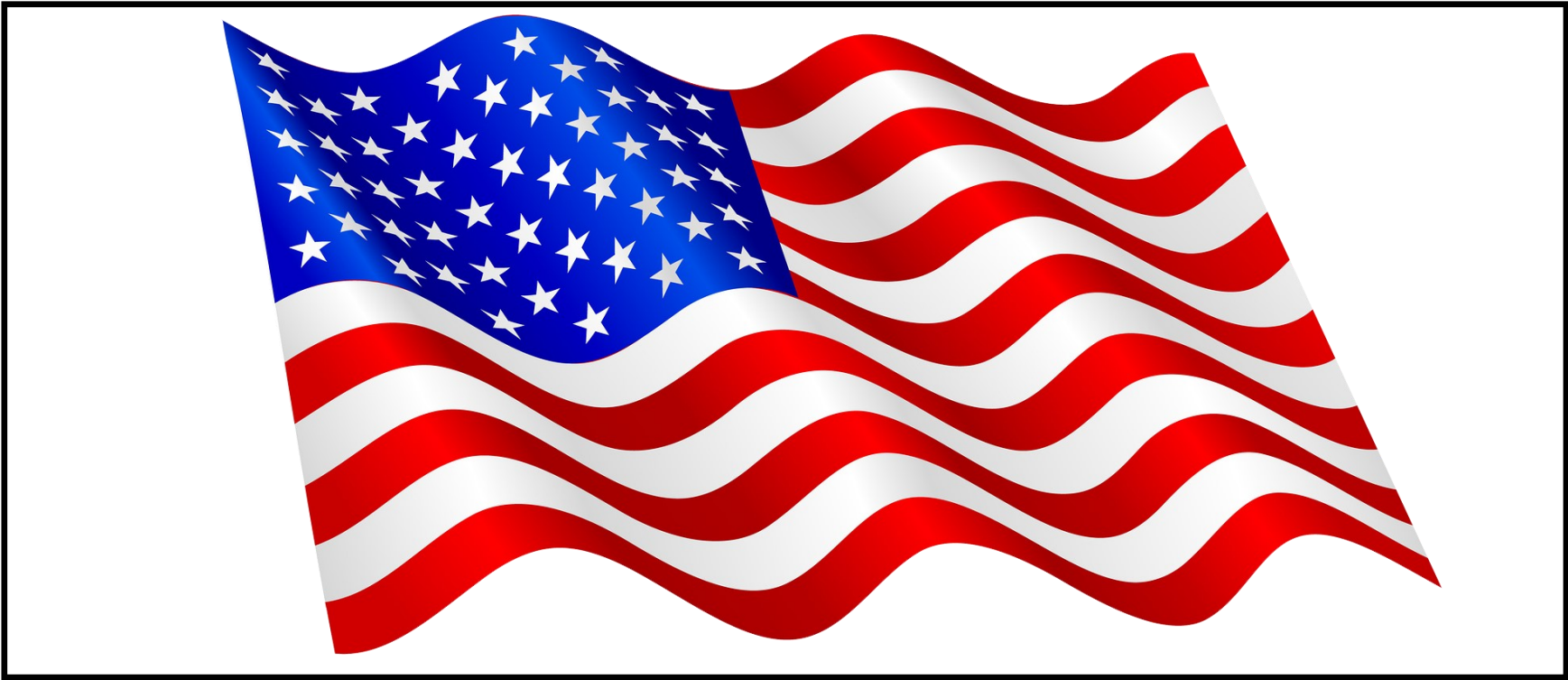
