MAY 1-14 @ THE PTF



- Up to 4 car tires \$ 5.00 per tire (reg. \$7.00)
- (16" and under) \$ 10.00 w/ rim (reg. \$14.00)
- 17" and greater \$ 350 per ton (reg. \$375)

Loads of 5 or more car tires will be weighed to determine charge based on \$350 per ton.

NOT ACCEPTED: Needles, syringes, thermometers, blood pressure kits, glucose monitoring devices

GUIDELINES

- Empty pills into a plastic sealable bag
- Keep liquids, creams, powders in original containers
- Recycle empty pill bottles and paper boxes at home

HOLIDAY LIGHT RECYCLING

Year Round at the Waupaga County PTF
November-January at Courthouse

ACCEPTED: Holiday light strands
NOT ACCEPTED: Plastic rope lights, bulbs

WAUPAGA COUNTY PTF

Solid Waste: garbage, furniture, toilets, shingles, windows, C & D debris, etc.

\$95.00 per ton; \$20.00 minimum charge (to 400lbs.)

Recyclables: plastic containers, steel cans, aluminum cans, glass bottles & jars, cardboard, mixed paper - No Charge

Electronics: \$0.25/lb. -TVs, VCR/DVD players, monitors, laptops, printers, tablets, keyboards, etc.

All open loads must be covered & secured

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

DISPOSAL COST

Flammable Liquids (gas, charcoal lighter, paint thinner)	\$0.60/lb.
Paint* (lead & oil-based only)	\$0.60/lb.
Stain, Varnish, Shellac	\$0.60/lb.
Concrete Sealer, Blacktop Sealer	\$0.60/lb.
Halogenated Solvents (degreasers, cleaners)	\$0.55/lb.
Aerosols (includes aerosol pesticides)	\$0.65/lb.
Acids/Bases (corrosives, drain cleaners)	\$0.65/lb.
Pesticides** (non-aerosol)	\$0.85/lb.
Poisons (cyanide)	\$0.70/lb.
Oxidizers (hypochlorite pool chemicals)	\$0.70/lb.
Flammable Solids (flares)	\$0.75/lb.
Peroxides (hardeners for fiberglass)	\$0.75/lb.
Mercury	\$25/lb.
Mercury Thermometers	\$0.45 ea.

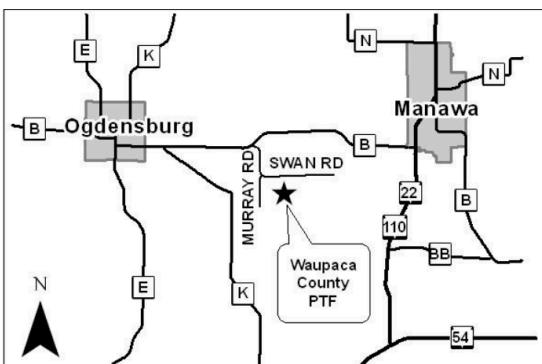
***Latex Paint** will not be accepted. Once **Latex Paint** is dry, it can be put in the trash.

Paint Hardener (\$4.00/bag) is available at the PTF & Waupaca County Courthouse.

****Pesticides in powder form must be double bagged to ensure containment.**

NOTE: Hazardous waste must be in a container that can be left at the PTF.
